

GEDA Construction recognises that construction related activities may impact upon the environment and has developed an Integrated Management System (IMS) to influence those impacts under our control.

Designed to meet the requirements of ISO 14001:2015, the IMS focus is on the commitment to pollution prevention and continual improvement of the environmental performance of our construction products, activities and services.

Accordingly, we have adopted the following policy that provides a framework for setting and reviewing our environmental objectives and targets. The framework is used for each project to provide a uniform approach to tackling environmental issues.

Specifically, we will:

- Ensure compliance with existing and future environmental legislation and other requirements to which we subscribe.
- Identify and seek to reduce the significant environmental aspects of our construction and development business and to prevent pollution.
- Liaise with external bodies (statutory and non-statutory) at all levels. Seek to acknowledge, respond appropriately and take account of the views of the public and other "interested parties" with respect to company operations.
- Optimise the use of resources and ensure we use processes, techniques, material and products that avoid, reduce or control pollution.
- Reduction of waste – develop and implement strategies to reduce waste generated through our construction activities
- Work with our suppliers, sub-contractors and clients to improve our overall environmental performance and wherever feasible influence them to do likewise.
- Require our employees to assist in the implementation of this policy and to work with due consideration. Provide appropriate training and supervision to ensure a programme of continual improvement is maintained.
- Commit adequate and sufficient physical and financial resources to ensure compliance

The Directors have overall responsibility for ensuring that the company policy and procedures are implemented and maintained.

This is achieved through one Partner having overall responsibility for Environmental issues with communication to the other Partners on all such topics.

It shall be reviewed and revised as necessary or on at least an annual basis.
